If you haven't started your spring garden, you're not too late! The big mesquite trees have just now started to leaf out, a sure sign that Spring is really here and freeze danger has passed...well, that's what Grandpa Lansford always said. (If you're looking for slightly more scientific data, our average date of the last spring frost is February 14.)

If you have started plants indoors, now's the time to get them in the ground. If you're starting from seed, you're not too late but time is of the essence; as is selecting the right plants.
